**Advanced Construction CTF (Mr. Law) Fee: \$25.00**

Students will be designing and creating more advanced projects in the area of woods. Students will continue work on construction theory and will be researching career opportunities in the field of Construction. Strong emphasis will be placed on Safety in the workplace and working cooperatively in a CTF lab setting. Students will be involved in the production side of the industry producing Adirondack chairs. In this complementary course students will be designing and creating a step stool project using various species of wood. **It is strongly recommended that students complete the Intermediate Construction module in term 1 or 2 or in previous years. (Please Note: This will be a double module that will run every day for term three and will count as two complementary courses.)**

**Art 7 Part A (Any grade can take it) (Mr. Spencer) Fee: \$15.00**

In term 1, students will explore drawing, painting, and sculpting. Students will explore line and value to create manga drawings. We will use armature and models to draw figures in motion. Students will paint landscapes in the style of Ted Harrison using color and value to simulate depth and perspective. We will also have the opportunity to create one of a kind creatures from clay to make stoneware sculptures to last the ages.

**Art 7 Part B (Any grade can take it) (Mr. Spencer) Fee: \$15.00**

In this second term of Art 7, students will continue to work with drawing, painting, and sculpting in a variety of contexts. We will examine still life in drawing and painting while learning to draw realistic 3 dimensional forms. Students will examine the work of George Little Child, an Alberta-born artist, and create paintings in response to his style and themes. We will also explore the many different styles of masks across cultures and create our own using additive and subtractive sculpting techniques.

**Art 8 Part A (Any grade can take it) (Mr. Spencer) Fee: \$15.00**

In this first term of Art 8, students will build on the experiences in drawing, painting, and sculpting from level 1. Students will create positive and negative space illustrations using pencil and graphite powder. We will design and draw complex perspective drawings using one and two-point perspective in interior and exterior spaces. Students will also create pop art paintings of 3 dimensional objects using value and color to create optical illusions in their work. Working in sculpting mediums, students will explore architecture and design buildings inspired by nature.

**Art 8 Part B (Any grade can take it) (Mr. Spencer) Fee: \$15.00**

In this second term of Art 8, students will continue to explore drawing, painting, and sculpting techniques. We will use value and basic shape to construct comic book illustrations. Pencil crayon techniques will be applied to compositions in realistic and imaginative ways. We will examine portraiture and experiment with color and shading to impact the mood presented in our paintings. Students will examine the artwork of Chuck Close and use a grid to achieve greater levels of realism in their compositions. Students will sculpt natural forms in clay, stone, or other three dimensional media.

**Art 9 Part A (Any grade can take it) (Mr. Spencer) Fee: \$15.00**

In this first term of Art 9 students will explore drawing towards greater levels of photo-realism and accuracy. We will paint in response to cultural and artistic styles explored in class such as Sumi watercolor techniques, abstraction, and impressionism. Students respond to themes and styles from various time periods and create a unique sound sculpture.

**Art 9 Part B (Any grade can take it) (Mr. Spencer) Fee: \$15.00**

In this third term of Art 9, students will continue to investigate and refine drawing, painting, and sculpting techniques and concepts. Students will respond to historical changes of how people and nature have been portrayed. Students will alter portraits to create altered versions of reality. We will refine perspective drawing to create point-of-view landscapes from an ant's or bird's eye view. We will select and research art movements and the artists that shaped them, creating our own reproductions of one of their works. Students will also design and carve organic shapes to form jewelry and wearable art sculptures

**Band 8 (Mr. Samuelson) Fee: \$10.00**

Students should have taken Band 7 in order to choose this option. Some exceptions apply, but students must speak to Mr. Samuelson. This is a full year option. Students choosing this class must be willing to commit for the full year.

**Band 9 (Mr. Samuelson) Fee: \$10.00**

This full year option can be selected only if students have taken band in grade seven and eight.

**Basketball (Mr. Finlayson) Fee: \$0.00**

Students will receive specialized skill and fitness training in basketball to prepare for and maintain skills required to excel on Riverview's basketball teams. Training will focus on offensive and defensive fundamentals, sportsmanship and teamwork to maximize each player's potential. This program is for serious, disciplined players looking to take their game to the next level. Nutrition, stretching and sports psychology will also be incorporated throughout the course.

**Career Studies (Mr. Swan) Fee: \$0.00**

This class is intended for students who want to make a connection between school and future occupations. Students will be required to do a few projects including a career search with emphasis on such topics as safety, technology and environmental stewardship. In addition to these projects, students will benefit from extra time and help on core assignments. Finally, students will set goals and work to improve organization.

**Drama - Term 1 & 3 (Ms. Iversen) Fee \$6.00**

*Acting, Costumes, Technical Theatre!*

*Testing, Testing One, two, three...*

Are you interested in learning about designing things such as costumes, sets and props? Drama may be just what you need! Are you interested in how to do the sound, lighting and technical aspects of theatre? Drama might be for YOU! Finally do you have a need for the spotlight, a dream to act and be a part of a production for everyone to see? Then Drama is for you! There will be a production for both Terms 1 & 3.

In Terms 1 & 3 Drama will focus on a One-Act play as well as improvisation games. There is more to Drama than just acting. Try your hand at costume, set and prop design for the play or get involved in the technical part of theatre and figure out the perfect lighting and how to make the actors sound fantastic! Drama is only offered in Terms 1 & 3. Don't hesitate! Sign up now!

**Environmental & Outdoor Education A & B (Mr. Haugjord) Fee: \$6.00 per term**

This outdoor activity-based course provides students with opportunities for in-depth, practical studies and experiences. This approach should appeal to all students, particularly those who learn best from physical involvement. Through a variety of outdoor experiences, students will be required to assume many responsibilities for their learning by building personal outdoor skills and through assuming responsibility for individual and group welfare, as well as fostering in them a strong sense of environmental stewardship. Examples of activities in the course include: orienteering/GPS route finding, mountain biking, nordic skiing, basic sport-climbing, shelter building, fly tying & casting, outdoor cooking, etc.

**Fitness and Games (Mr. Rosentreter) Fee: \$5.00**

This option is highly activity based and is for students who want to focus on improving their personal fitness goals. It is an excellent choice for students that are wanting to bring their "game" to the next level no matter what sport they play. There will be a focus on developing all aspects of personal fitness, to create gains through a variety of training methods. Students are expected to come to class EVERY class wanting to sweat and work hard!

**Foods (Ms. Iversen and Mrs. Kehoe) Fee: 15.00**

Foods will now be a challenge-based, multi-skill level course, where students will be grouped with peers of the same cooking level and experience. Through the duration of the term, groups will complete cooking projects from start to finish. This includes gathering recipes, working as a group to determine the recipe that is most feasible and appealing, researching the skills and safety required to prepare the recipe from start to finish, providing documented proof of understanding of preparation and cooking techniques, recording the recipe in their personal cookbook, preplanning roles for each group member (from prep, to cooking to clean-up), making a grocery list and determining the approximate cost for each recipe, preparing and enjoying each recipe, and finally, reflecting on the skills employed for each project. Effort and engagement will determine how many projects each group accomplishes in a term.

**Football (Mr. Rosentreter) Fee: \$0.00**

Football option- In this class, students will learn the basics of football. This will include passing, receiving, kicking and defensive play. Time will also be spent looking at different strategies in the game. This will be an active class with the majority of classes taking place outdoors. Students will need to be changed and be prepared to be active

**Hockey (Mr. Rosentreter) Fee: \$3.00**

Students will enhance their hockey skills through on ice drills. Emphasis will be on skating, passing and shooting skill development and improvement. Students will be on the ice at the arena until 2:45 each day of the class. They will need to make arrangements to get home as busses will not be available. There is no cost, but students will need to have some experience in the sport. Equipment required will be a helmet with full mask, gloves, stick and skates.

**Intro to Construction/ Fabrications CTF (Mr. Law) Fee: \$25.00**

This option provides the student the opportunity to study and explore a few major material areas and to witness processes found in the construction and fabrication industries in Canada. Along with important career information this hands on option will help students develop a degree of skill mastery in the three areas of plastics, sheet metal and earths (ceramics). Strong emphasis will be placed on safety and working cooperatively in a CTF multiple activity lab setting. Students will also participate in a design component learning basic drafting principles. Students will have an opportunity to identify and incorporate cross-curricular connections in a more practical setting. **It is strongly recommended that students take this module in Term 1 before taking Intermediate Construction.**

**Intermediate Construction CTF (Mr. Law) Fee: \$25.00**

This module will introduce the student to the construction industry and the area of woods. Student will have the opportunity to learn (through hands on experience) about process, operations, materials, tools and equipment. Student will learn how to properly identify, measure, layout, cut, shape, and assemble material. Strong emphasis will be placed on safety and working cooperatively in the CTF lab. Students will be required to design and create a clock out of wood using more than one species of wood. **It is recommended that students take Intro. to Construction/Fabrications before taking this module. If student is planning on taking Advanced Construction CTF in term 3 this module is strongly recommended.**

**Introduction to Coding (Mrs. Giles) Fee: \$0.00**

This course will introduce the student to building real working apps, games and websites using blocks, JavaScript and more. Students will get to see their code in action using ozobots and spheros lent to us from the division technology department. Students will learn about the growing potential of the computer science field and what career opportunities are available.

**Keep Calm & Stitch On (Mrs. Kehoe)**

In this class we will be creating a number of projects using fabrics, yarn and other materials. Following patterns will be a skill students will need to master. Students can look forward to mastering new skills while completing projects involving stitching, sewing and crocheting.

**Outdoor Games and Activities 7/8/9 (Mr. Rosentreter) Fee: \$0.00**

In this class, we will be participating in a variety of outdoor yard games (Bocce, Spikeball, Kan jam, etc.) and activities (Biking, swimming, golf, baseball/softball, soccer, etc.). Students will need to bring a positive attitude and be willing to participate in a plethora of different activities in the great outdoors.

**Photography level 1 (Mrs. Giles) Fee: \$10.00**

Photographs play an important role in our lives. We photograph to preserve memories, document events, and create artistic works. This course introduces students to the basics of photography, including camera functions and photo composition. Students will learn what it takes to create a good photograph and how to improve photographs of animals, people, and vacations. They will also begin working with their photographs using photo-editing software. Through a variety of assigned challenges, students will engage their creativity by photographing a range of subjects and learning to see the world through the lens of their cameras. **Students must have access to their own digital camera to take course at this time.**

**Photography Level 2 (Mrs. Giles) Fee: \$10.00**

Must have taken Photography Level 1. The focus of this course will be to build on the skills developed in Photography Level 1. More focus will be on using manual settings and composition work. Having your own camera with manual settings is **recommended** to be able to get the most practice but there are a few class cameras to share.

**Robotics (Mr. Swan) Fee: \$5.00**

The robotics course gives students the opportunity to design, build, and program working robots that accomplish a wide range of goals. Riverview's robotics program uses NXT and EV3 Mindstorms® products, the same products used by high school robotics courses. In this course students will be using a programming language based called Labview which is used in many careers such as Astrophysics and engineering. These Lego sets combine programmable bricks with electric motors, sensors, and Lego Technic pieces (such as gears, axles, and beams) to allow students great creative flexibility in meeting set challenges. These challenges include following a choreographed routine, autonomous movement about a room, synchronized movement and interaction between robots, and more.

**Science & Engineering Tech (Mr. Parkinson) Fee: \$5.00**

We will complete a number of challenges that will require students to make use of concepts related to science and engineering principles. Challenges will be hands on requiring students to create a device or structure that meets specific requirements. Additional projects will allow students to expand upon materials they will covered in their science classes. We will also look at how your interest in science and engineer might translate into a future career.

**Soccer (Mr. van den Bijgaart) Fee: \$0.00**

In this class, students will learn the basics of soccer. This will include passing, receiving, shooting and defensive play. Time will also be spent looking at different strategies in the game, as well as the FIFA laws of the game. This will be an active class with the majority of classes taking place outdoors. Students will need to be changed and be prepared to be active. A pair of soccer cleats is strongly recommended but not mandatory.

**Spanish Language and Culture (Mr. Law) Fee: 1.00**

This is a conversational Spanish course. Students will learn the basics from counting to different phrases needed to function in a Spanish environment. Part of the course will be dedicated to Latin American culture and more specifically Guatemala culture. Material will be drawn from the Alberta Education Program of Studies Spanish Language and Culture Six-Year Program.

**Sports Performance (Mr. Rosentreter) Fee: \$0.00**

This will be an opportunity for the students to improve their skills in a variety of sports. The option will be focused primarily on volleyball, basketball and badminton. It will also involve working as leaders in the intramural program and sports team officiating.

**Student Leadership Council (Mrs. Ceulemans) Fee: \$5.00**

The Student Leadership Council will run as a progressive class from Term 1 through Term 3. The more terms a student is involved, while demonstrating independence, initiative, and work ethic, the more leadership responsibility they will be given in the school. Students who sign up for this course should have a keen interest in developing their leadership skills and have the desire to actively participate in class and throughout the school each day. Self-motivation and excellent communication skills are a must for this course. The Student Leadership Council will plan and organize special events within the school, volunteer to help out in the school and community, encourage and inspire school spirit amongst their peers, and demonstrate a sense of pride and ownership of being RMS RAIDERS.
